GIRLS' HOMES

The girls are enjoying their 2 new houses which made it possible for the boys to spread out. With desks, lockers, study space, and more bathrooms, their quality of life is much improved.



SECURITY FENCE

A high-security fencing system, including two new gates and a guard shack, was built around the entire perimeter of the property.





STEPPING STONES ROOF


The roof at the Stepping Stones building (our dedicated center for children with special needs), had endured many years of patch jobs to prevent leaks. In 2022, the entire roof was rebuilt after patching work was no longer effective. The construction crew worked quickly so there was very little disruption to the children's daily routines.

RAINWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM

Fourteen water tanks, each with a 5,000-liter capacity, were installed next to various buildings around campus.

CARPORT

Members of South Hills Church built a 5 stall carport to protect vehicles from the elements.







DENTAL PROCEDURES

An incredible team from the state of New York visited. The group included two dentists who examined all of the kids and did cleanings, fillings, and extractions. Other team members acted as dental assistants, computer technicians, soccer coaches, science teachers, and seminar instructors.



COCHLEAR IMPLANT SURGERY

3-year-old Joanie received the gift of hearing! She travels to Nairobi with Nurse Abby or Mama Carla twice a month for audiology appointments and speech therapy.



METRINE

Metrine was rescued in 2019. She lives with a disease called vitiligo, which causes the loss of skin color in blotches. Due to her lack of medical care prior to coming to *In Step*, her patches were surging at a rapid pace. With twice-weekly, treatments and special sunscreen, Metrine's vitiligo symptoms are well-managed and nearly invisible.

REPLACEMENT WHEELCHAIRS

Our missionaries from Arizona were instrumental in getting larger wheelchairs for several *In Step* children who had outgrown theirs. Additionally, four local children were blessed with increased mobility after the outgrown wheelchairs had been given to them.

Four greenhouses provide a bounty of fruits and vegetables on campus. However, due to the extreme sun exposure, the plastic was deteriorating. Three out of the four greenhouses were re-covered – the remaining greenhouse will be re-covered after its crops are harvested. Joining scrap plastic from the greenhouses, a makeshift laundry cover was constructed to protect drying clothes from the upcoming rainy season.
