Dear Friends,

What a year it has been! The kids are thriving in every way, we have the most reliable staff we have ever had, and Jeff and I are both healthy. **God is good!** I want to give credit where credit is due – God is our Provider, God is our Healer, God is our Strength. God gives wisdom when we ask for it. God lights the path when we don't know the way.

Our farm continues to be a cornerstone of our self-sustainability efforts. We hired an experienced horticulturalist in 2024 to advise us and saw an immediate rise in the production of healthy green vegetables. In fact, we harvested (and consumed) more than 1,200 cabbages, 30,580 pounds of green vegetables, and more than 20,000 pounds of bananas.

Why do we need so much food? This year we were home to 222 orphaned and abused children at our In Step Children's Home campus. Those who attend our Academy were joined by 122 kids from low-income families in the community for daily classes. That is a lot of children to feed on a regular basis!

Nurse Abby is our full-time medical professional and takes such great care of the kids, no matter what their ailment might be. Of course, in Kenya malaria is very common and requires immediate treatment. Last year, she treated 151 cases of malaria. What a blessing to have access to the necessary care and medicines!

God has impressed upon your heart to join Him in what He is doing in the lives of these beautiful children, and you have accepted the calling. Thank you for using your God-given gifts, talents and resources to give our kids hope for a bright future.



SHANTEL'S NEW SONG

Every day, children in Kenya are abandoned, orphaned, or abused due to poverty, disease, or death of family. As a result, millions of Kenyan children are orphaned or are chronically vulnerable. **This is the reason for the existence of Rehema for Kids.**

One of the 2024 additions to our family is Shantel, a resilient sevenyear-old girl with a wisdom far beyond her years. Shantel is a French

name that means "little song" or "songbird". She was rescued by compassionate neighbors from an extremely abusive environment and brought into our care. Shantel speaks openly about the hardships she has endured, including the painful story behind the severe burns on her back and other traumatic experiences no child should ever face. **Despite her past, she carries a remarkable strength that continues to inspire those around her.**



Although Shantel had never attended school, we decided to place her in the campus dormitory with her peers. Typically, children move into the dorm when they start second grade, regardless of age, but socially, she simply wasn't fitting in with the younger ones.

It turned out to be a wonderful decision. Today, she is thriving—her face is always lit up with a smile, and she's right at the heart of all the activities in the young girls' dorm. She has made

friends effortlessly and often expresses just how much she loves her new home!

Jer 29:11 (NIV): "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."






The year 2024 was full of new territory to navigate. As kids age out of the children's home and become independent, responsible members of society, we have been challenged to implement policies to get them on the right path. A big part of the solution is a new partnership with Daystar University in Nairobi. They have embraced our three girls who began their studies; helping them navigate the educational system, secure housing, and attend Bible studies. Eliza is studying Agriculture, Jenny is studying Entrepreneurial Business while Vero is pursuing Psychology with the hopes of eventually becoming a licensed counselor. All three of them are thriving both academically and personally.

Equally encouraging, Eldoret Polytechnic has welcomed In Step graduate, Benny, for IT studies. Eldoret is Kenya's center of excellence in technological advancement and he is doing very well. **Benny's experience is showing us the need for an increased focus on jobskills training** at the In Step campus as children with this category of motivation and gifting go through our program. You will be hearing more about the Technical Worskhop we plan to build on our campus later in the year, so stay tuned!

We are very hopeful for the future - thank you for standing with us as we stand with them!!




